# Welcome to Arlington, TN

The Town of Arlington, located in Shelby County, Tennessee, began as Haysville (incorporated 1878), a community built around the Withe train depot for the Memphis & Ohio Railroad. In 1900, the Town was renamed and incorporated by its present name, Arlington, Tennessee. Arlington is one of seven municipalities in Shelby County, and has been called the county's best-kept secret, as it has remained a small, quiet town since it was founded.

At the time of the town's charter in 1900, Arlington had a population of just over 600. The 2010 census showed Arlington as the second fastest growing community in the State of Tennessee, with a 348% increase in population from 2000 to 2010; today's population is almost 13,000.

The Town of Arlington is proud of its history, preserving historic landmarks in Arlington's Depot Square such as the Rachel H.K. Burrows Museum, S.Y. Wilson & Company, the Blacksmith Shop, the Historic Post Office, and a replica built in 2003 of the original railroad depot station of the 1800s which serves the community as the Arlington Senior Citizens Center. Besides these landmarks, Depot Square boasts retail and restaurants, and during the year, hosts events such as Arlington in April, Music on the Square, the Arlington 5K, Harvest Gathering, the Christmas



# Parade, and Christmas on the Square.

Throughout its history, Arlington has met the challenge of blending old and new. Outside Depot Square, Arlington is comprised of a growing retail area, an industrial park (from where goods are shipped all over the world), well-planned residential developments, schools and churches – all situated at the transportation crossroad of 1-40 and SR 385, making Arlington easily accessible to other areas of the Mid-South.

Arlington has recently been named, Best City in Tennessee to Raise a Family (September 2015), Best City for Young Families in Tennessee (January 2015), and Best City for Homeownership in Tennessee (March 2014). Today's leaders are planning effectively for the future, all the while, preserving the influences of the past that make Arlington unique. Come and visit Arlington, Tennessee!
